



CAT. 192 Late 17th century, 130 x 184 cm, 1220 kn/dm²

All the examples of this small group are characterised by a single pointed or rounded niche supported by two to five columns.

The *mibrab* is usually red and there is almost always a floral ornament in place of the lamp.

The borders are in Ottoman style, often based on a hexagonal cartouche of different colours with floral ornaments.
